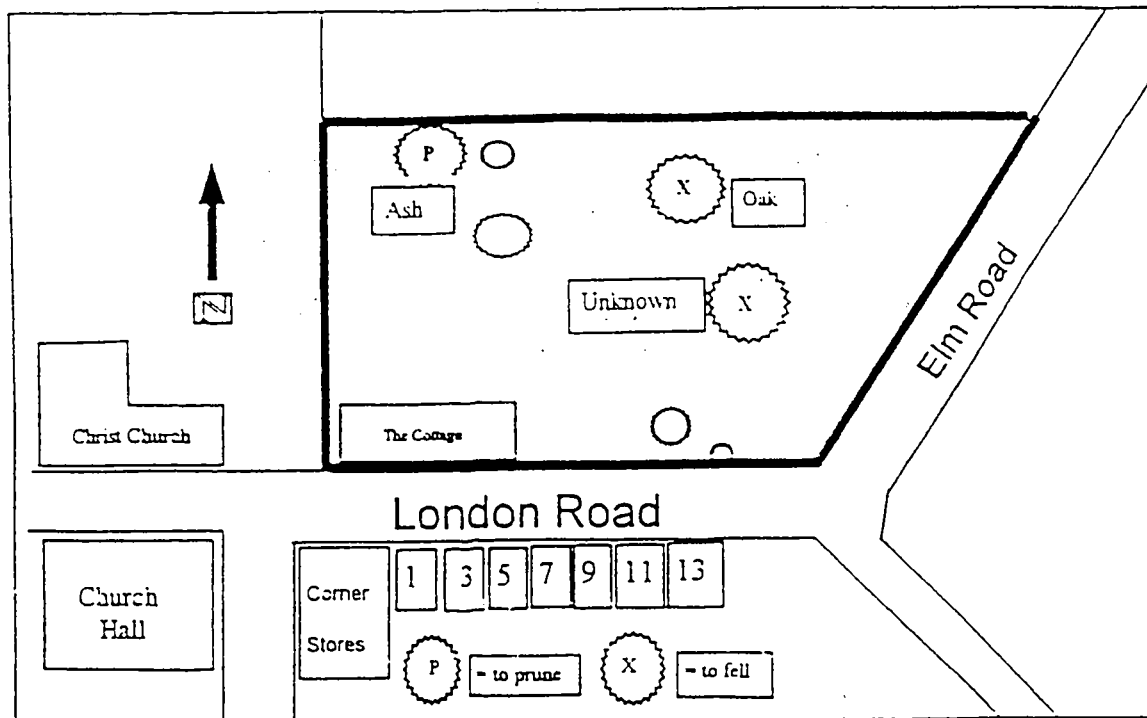

1. Some individual trees and some groups of trees are the subject of Tree Preservation Orders, which means that any landowner or occupier must obtain the Borough Council's permission to fell, lop or prune such trees, unless the trees are dead, dying or dangerous (in which case Council permission is not required). In order to establish whether protected trees are dead, dying or dangerous, you may contact the Borough Technical Services Officer's Department on 01932 838383. If trees are felled or lopped without permission you may be prosecuted, fined and required to replace with new trees, including replanting in the same place.
2. All trees in Conservation Areas exceeding 75mm in diameter at 1.5 metres above ground level are automatically protected by law (again unless they are dead, dying or dangerous) and the Council must be notified of any proposed works to such trees. In this case, the Council is required to make a decision within six weeks.
3. In some instances, trees are protected by a condition attached to a planning permission and the procedure relating to trees protected by a Tree Preservation Order (Note 1 above) should be followed.
4. When the Council receives your application, an officer will inspect the tree(s) and you will be notified, in writing, of the Council's decision shortly thereafter.
5. If your application is refused, then you have a right of appeal to the Department of the Environment. You should write to :-

6. Finally, it is important to remember that these procedures are necessary in order to safeguard the Borough's landscape and environment.

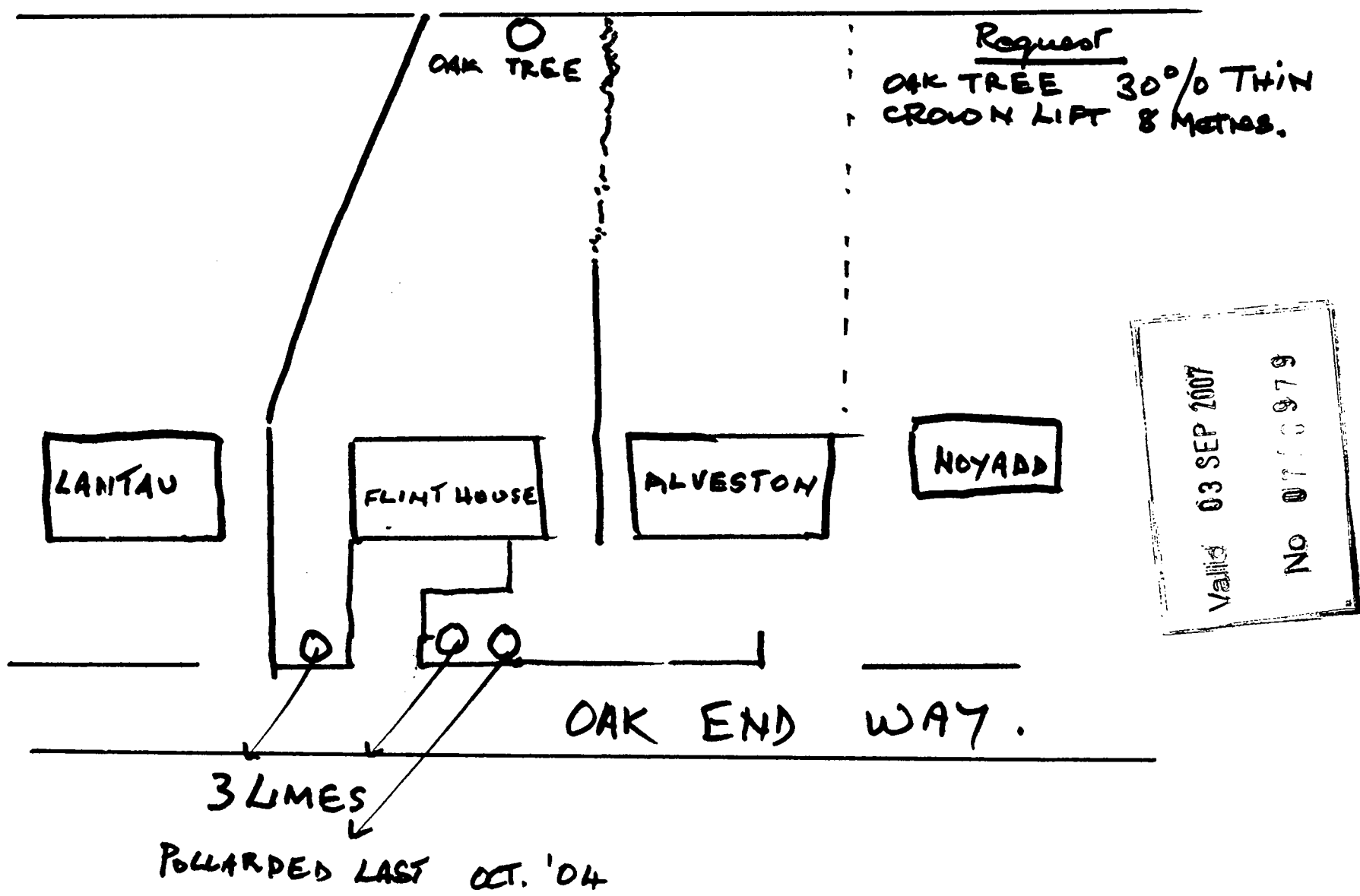
AN EXAMPLE OF A TYPICAL PLAN TO ACCOMPANY AN APPLICATION OR NOTICE
